NR 502.5 M. Kekuanaoa lists the Fort lands

NR 439.5 M. Kekuanaoa lists the lands of Victoria, Moses, Lot, Ruth and himself. "The writing was arranged by J.W.H. Paalua, January, 1848." NR 440.5 Victoria's lands listed.

FT 538.3 M. Kekuanaoa for Victoria, counter the Government re fishpond

called Kawa in Honolulu.

FT 408.3 "Copy of the division of lands agreed upon in Privy Council August 27, 1850. Kekuanaoa and his children to receive Fee Simple titles for those lands here set off to them, they resigning to the Govt. all title to the other lands granted them in the Buke Mahele."

NT 373.10 Waianae 17 Aug. 1854: Testimony on the boundary between the ahupuaa of Waianae and the ili of Pahoa.

NR 147.1 [FF trans.] This place was from Kinopu, who had a friendship with a Pake hana wati [Chinese watch maker?..Trans.] living in Hilo; it was for him, and when Kinopu died, I was the heir. This house lot was for the Poe Pake Puhi Palaoa [Chinese bakers..Trans.].

FT 29.3 Abner Paki, witness for Kekuanaoa: land received from Kinau, who had it from Piia; Piia from Keeaumoku who came into possession about 1817.

"Counter claimants Hoaai, Paukunui, Adam Kaiwi [Claim] 232 and Keamahulia [Claim] 233 have rights to houses on this lot. Agreed between parties that each should possess several parts of this land as long as they lived, and that the land should then return to Kekuanaoa to hold for Victoria."

LCA 175 to Kamamalu, Merchant St., Honolulu. A very small piece; see Greer Map 1986

Claim 177 Kekuanaoa claimed for himself; awarded to Kamamalu

NR 148.1 Pa of the kahu(s) of Moses Kekuaiwa. Samuel Kuluwailehua complained to the Chief Justice that I had done wrong; I paid a \$50.00 fine. That place became mine.

FT 30.3 Abner Paki witness: Kekuanaoa claims title from Kinau. It is Victoria's land.

Claim 178

NR 148.1 Pahale of G.P. Judd and Keikenui was Kinau's own; now Kamamalu's.

FT 30.3 Abner Paki says "Clt. bought it from a foreigner whose native name I only know--Alaala. He had a little dram shop on it. It was about 1839. It is his own land. I heard he paid \$50.00 for it."

LCA 178 to Kamamalu, lot on King St., 0.67 ac/1 ap.

Claim 182 "Not Awarded"

NR 150.1 "Sketch 25" Kekuanaoa: "From Wahinealii to M. Kekuanaoa" FT 31.3 Clt. [Kekuanaoa] had it from Wahinealii, a chief, to hold for Victoria, in 1844. Wahinealii now lives there and has possessed it in peace since time of Kamehameha I.

NT 29.2 "Diagram 25"

Claim 183

NR 150.1 "Sketch 24" Kekuanaoa says: This place was formerly Kinopu's--it was unused. When I returned from Britain one small house belonging to Kinopu was standing and afterwards we two fenced it and built some houses; this was the time I married Pauahi [1825], that is how we two have a right to this place.

FT 31.3 Recd. from Koiamai and Keahamakani in 1840. They gave it to Victoria and Clt. [MK] holds it for her, they ever since living under Kekuanaoa.
